## WRITING RATES AS PERCENTS

To write a rate as a percent, do the following steps.

- 1. Write the rate as a fraction.
- 2. Re-write the fraction as an equivalent fraction that has a denominator of 100.
- 3. Use the numerator of your new fraction to make the percent.

For example, if you were given 35 out of 50. Here is how to write it as a %.

35 out of 50 = 
$$\frac{35}{50}$$
.

50 goes into 100 twice, so I can multiply 50 by 2 to get to 100. If I do it to the denominator, I must also do it to the numerator.

So, 
$$\frac{35 \cdot 2}{50 \cdot 2} = \frac{70}{100} = 70\%$$

Let's do another one. Say you have a rate of 18 out of 40.

18 out of 40 = 
$$\frac{18}{40}$$
.

However, 40 does not go into 100 without a remainder. So, we need to re-write the fraction with different number that will go into 100 without a remainder. Or in other words, I must *SIMPLIFY my fraction* before I can make the denominator 100.

So, since 2 goes into both 18 and 40, I can do the following:

$$\frac{18}{40} = \frac{18 \div 2}{40 \div 2} = \frac{9}{20}$$
. 20 goes into 100 evenly 5 times. So multiply both 9 and 20 by 5.

$$\frac{9 \cdot 5}{20 \cdot 5} = \frac{45}{100}$$
. So, 18 out of  $40 = \frac{18}{40} = \frac{9}{20} = \frac{45}{100} = 45\%$ .
